Friday, November 11th is Veterans Day. The Borough expresses its appreciation and gratitude to all those who have served and protected our nation.

The Borough would like to notify the public of several upcoming events.

On Monday, November 14th at 6:00pm, a budget workshop for the public will be held at Borough Hall (600 S. Broad Street). Residents will have the opportunity to engage with Borough department heads and ask any questions pertaining to the proposed 2023 budget. On Tuesday November 15th at 6:00pm, a 50th Anniversary Memorial to honor Police Officers Richard J. Posey and William W. Davis will be held at the 100 block of E. Linden Street (between the garage entrance and N. Broad Street). On November 15th 1972, Officers Posey and Davis were tragically killed in the line of duty while serving the Borough. The 100 block of E. Linden Street (between garage entrance and N. Broad Street) will be closed from 4pm-7pm.

On Thursday, November 17th, at 6:30pm, Kennett Collaborative will hold its next How We Build Matters Speaker Series event at the Presbyterian Church of Kennett Square (211 S. Broad St.). Urban designer and author Thomas Dougherty will explain the art and science of human scale and share a vision for the potential of human-scaled infill development along Kennett Square's alleys and innerblock spaces. On Saturday, November 19th at 4:00pm, the American Legion Post 491 will host a rededication of the World War I Monument at Mary D. Lang School at Center and Mulberry Streets. On Friday, November 25th, at 6:15pm, the annual Kennett Square Holiday Light Parade and Tree Lighting will usher in the holiday season with music and dance troupes, community groups, and an assortment of vehicles festooned with lights. Please note that, in order to avoid traffic congestion, the parade will follow a new route this year. The parade will begin at the intersection of South Broad and East Cypress Streets, heading north onto State Street and then west along State Street to Center Street. There will be applicable street closures to accommodate this event.
